He had been our main point of contact since we first started about doing the project. After I swallowed hard, he told me that he and his wife had decided that now was the time for the two of them to go off on a life adventure, accordingly they had both quit their jobs, sold their house, bought an RV and decided to drive to Ecuador! I started to gasp about then as I was thinking we just gave our windows and part payment to this company and this guy is on his way to South America. Swell.

Not to worry. I have subsequently spoken to Fred Shea, the president of the company, and I am once again confident that our precious windows are in good hands. They are in the process of cleaning and examining our glass with a mind to replacing any fractured glass. He has invited us out to their studio in Hampden Massachusetts around the end of October to view the progress. He informs me that they can handle a group of 6-10 people easily, and only asks that we set up a date and time well in advance. He anticipates that our windows will be back before Winter, which those who may be interested in going. More info as to date and time to follow.
