Rally Day, Sept. 9th, will be a day of blessing for the season ahead, uniting us in God's love, covenant and fellowship with gospel music and backpack blessings. We will be blessed with a baptism September 15 of Vivian, rejoicing that a baby who made her first appearance at our church at Easter will be here. September 23rd we will have the wonderful Just Peace Plays perform a play celebrating the women of the Greatest Generation, led by Rev. Fran Bogle. Church leaders have worked hard this summer to address occasions of church conflict. Conflict is bound to happen in any organization. Church leaders have learned tools which we will share throughout the year for helping us develop healthier ways to improve respectful, faithful, covenantal communication, which our loving savior challenges us to do. We are developing a church covenant, relying upon God's grace. We had our first church council in 2 ½ years which is a step in the right direction. Church leaders are meeting monthly to work on

church goals, planning and vision. If you have ideas you would like us to consider, please let me know. You are welcome at any meeting.

One goal this program year is to redevelop a church vision --finding together our "Why."
